Judge David Rees said 50-year-old John E. Brennan was indeed stripping in protest of what Brennan saw as invasive Transportation Security Administration screening procedures.

"It is the speech itself that the state is seeking to punish, and that it cannot do," Rees said.

The Multnomah County District Attorney's Office had argued during the brief trial Wednesday that Brennan violated a Portland city ordinance by exposing his genitalia to the opposite sex in a public place.

But the judge agreed with Brennan and his attorney, Michael E. Rose, who argued Brennan was exercising his freedom of speech and protest.

After the judge announced his ruling, more than a dozen of Brennan's friends, who were present in the courtroom, erupted in applause and cheers. Moments later, they hugged Brennan.

Judge acquits John Brennan on indecent exposure charge

To protest TSA practices last April, John Brennan of Portland stripped down naked at a Portland International Airport checkpoint and was arrested. Judge David Rees found him not guilty.

One friend stuck a sticky note on Brennan's chest. It read: "Sir Godiva" -- a reference to the legend of a noblewoman who rode naked on a horse through the streets of England to protest oppressive taxation.
